

In April 2017, President France was named the 2017 ATHENA Award winner for Windsor-Essex. In January 2020, President France was named the recipient of the Paul Harris Fellow Award by Rotary 1918 to recognize her considerable contributions. In June 2022, President France was awarded a Doctor of Laws honoris causa by Assumption University for her outstanding contributions to higher education in Windsor-Essex County. In May 2023, the Multicultural Council of Windsor and Essex County awarded President France with the Herb Gray Harmony Award in recognition of her outstanding contributions to building a more welcoming community for all in Windsor-Essex. In August 2023, she was awarded with a key to the City of Windsor for assisting the community during the COVID -19 pandemic. In October 2023, President France was the 2023 recipient of the Windsor-Essex Regional Chamber of Commerce's Lifetime Achievement Award due to her outstanding personal and professional accomplishments, coupled with her invaluable contributions to the community. In February 2024, President France was presented with the 2023 Hand In Hand Award from In Honour of the Ones we Love at their 26th Anniversary Gala.

Patti's personal involvement in various charitable causes has been reflected by the College's support of a number of community projects and programs during her Presidency. For instance, St. Clair's hosting of The Polar Plunge during the past half-decade has raised \$235,000 for the Special Olympics. The College's sponsorship of the annual "S'Aints" Christmas Concert at Caesars Windsor has garnered over \$400,000 for food banks in Windsor Essex and Chatham-Kent during the past decade. Patti encourages the use of the term "community college" to demonstrate St. Clair's efforts to enhance the well-being of citizens throughout southwestern Ontario.

President France's chief concentration remains St. Clair's delivery of exceptional, employment-ready education and skills to students. The fact that she was, when appointed, the first President in Canada whose preliminary education was obtained within the college system (Computer Programming, St. Clair, 1994) made her an example of the far-reaching value of a college-based education. The fact that her original education was in a technical field has made her an example – and advocate – of "Women in STEM" educational pursuits and careers. Indeed, female enrolment in science, technology-and-trades, engineering and math-related programs has increased significantly during her Presidency. President France has, similarly, fostered the enrolment of more men in program areas that are "non-traditional" such as nursing, health care and social services.

President France prides herself on her transparency to ensure that St. Clair College remains on the cutting edge of academic programming.

In early 2020, she returned to Windsor working part time and focused her time toward studying horticulture and volunteering at a local regenerative farm to gain knowledge of local food systems. In the following year she applied to WEST's Introduction to Construction Craft Trades for Women program with a desire to gain theoretical and practical construction skills, and working experience with the job placement. Dayna continued her Level 1 and 2 construction studies with LIUNA Local 625's Training Centre and gained apprenticeship hours at the Gordie Howe International Bridge. She challenged and passed the Construction Craft Worker Red Seal Exam and achieved CCW Journeyperson status in November 2023. Dayna recently accepted a job in the training support section at the naval school in Esquimalt, British Colombia and is considering changing her military occupation to one in technical aircraft maintenance. She has goals to advance her second language skills and pursue roles in military leadership.


